1. Plot, plan and produce an extended piece of creative writing
2. Develop a narrative voice, plot structure and characterisation as appropriate to the chosen genre(s)
3. Compose, refine and reflect on the process of producing an extended piece of creative writing, in response to feedback and in collaboration with others as appropriate
4. Produce texts of potential interest to intended audience/readerships

CONTENT

Close readings of model texts; weekly discussion of genre and process; planning, development, and revision toward successful submission of a creative writing project.

LEARNING & TEACHING STRATEGIES

Students participate in seminars and workshops, contribute to discussions about works in progress, undertake independent creative writing projects as mentored by members of the teaching team, and reflect on the process of producing an extended piece of creative writing.
