PRESCRIPTOR

He whakaako i te reo me ngā tikanga i raro i te maru o te wānanga. An advanced introduction to tikanga Māori and functional te reo Māori in a marae setting. Te Ao Māori is explored in traditional and contemporary contexts.

1. Demonstrate an understanding of key Māori cultural values and practices including tap, noa and manaakitanga
2. Perform a simple item of Māori performing arts (waiata, poi and haka)
3. Show an understanding of cultural competency and cultural sensitivity
4. Demonstrate a knowledge of the history and cultural importance of the carvings in the whareniui

CONTENT

1. Ngā tikanga o te marae: Māori epistemology, traditions, customs and protocols
2. Te reo Māori: language acquisition at a beginner's level of competency including greetings, pepeha/whakapapa (genealogy) and whakahua kupu – proficient pronunciation
3. Ngā Mahi a-Rēhia – Performing arts activities: Kapa haka, waiata, haka and poi
